LIBRARY INFORMATION

1. Members of the Indian Cultural Society of Tasmania are free members of the Library.
2. Non-members of the Indian Cultural Society of Tasmania or members of any other organization must pay a fee of only \$2.00 for an annual membership.
3. All members of the Library should notify the Librarian their correct addresses and telephone numbers and any changes of addresses and telephone numbers.
4. One book per person is allowed to be borrowed at a time by a member for a period of two (2) weeks.
5. The borrower should keep the borrowed books safe from little children. If books are damaged then the member is liable to pay for damaged books for the binding etc.
6. If the loaned book is lost please notify the Librarian (Mrs. S.D. Pathik) immediately in writing.
7. Reservations of the books. Borrower can reserve a book and it shall be kept with the Librarian for a limited period of two (2) weeks only.
8. Please feel free to use the Library facilities as much as possible as the services are given free to you by the Librarian.
9. People who are doing a project or research will be given special privileges and priorities by the Librarian.
10. When Library is in session then the members are required to observe the SILENCE sign for the benefit of the others and the Librarian.
