Indian Contemporary Feature Films

The High Commission of India, Canberra, A.C.T., is promoting an exposition of six Indian contemporary feature films this month in Hobart.

A synopsis of each of the films is given in the attached leaflet.

The films will be shown by the Tasmanian Branch of the National Film Theatre of Australia on 7, 14 and 21 November 1973 at 7.45 pm in the Arts Lecture Theatre, University of Tasmania, Sandy Bay. The NFPA was not in a position, on the day this newsletter was written, to state in which order the films would be shown.

NFPA screenings are for members only and membership costs \$3.00 per person and lasts for twelve months. The Tasmanian Branch of the NFPA shows about seven to eight seasons of films during the twelve months. After a person becomes a member, he or she may attend film shows two nights free of charge and every night thereafter the cost is \$1.00.
